


# LKS2 Newsletter – End of Term 1

P.E. this term will again be on **Mondays** and **Fridays** – although, please keep your PE kit in school throughout the week.


Home learning comes home on **Wednesday** and is due back on **Monday**.

I have enjoyed having the helpful year 4s because they don't tell me the answer but they help me figure it out. Connie







