

Unit No. 9 A Year Group: LKS2 Question: How does Krakow compare to Bristol?

I already know...

England is split up into 48 parts or **counties**. **South Gloucestershire** and **Bristol** are **counties** in the **South West of England**.

Local means in a particular area. Yate is a town that is local to Bradley Stoke. Bristol is a city that is local to Bradley Stoke.

Urban means belonging to, or relating to, a town or city.

Rural means any area that isn't urban – belonging to, or relating to, the countryside.

Land use is the specific purpose the land is used for. E.g. **agricultural** (farming including soil, crops and animals), **residential** (where people are residents e.g. house, flats), **recreational** (where people carry out activity for enjoyment e.g. leisure centre), **commercial** (land that is used to create a profit e.g. shops), **industrial** (for industry e.g. factories) and **transport** (e.g. roads).


A **green space** is land with vegetation or water in an urban area e.g. play areas, allotments

A **landmark** is a building or place that is easily recognised, e.g. war memorial.

A **4 figure** grid reference tells you an exact location on a map.

Essential Knowledge and Vocabulary

Krakow	Pronounced 'krak-ov'. Krakow is the second-largest city in Poland.
Poland	A country in Central Europe. Poland has the fifth-largest population in Europe.
population	The population of a country or area is all the people who live in it. Krakow has a population of around 700,000.
city	A city is a large town.
compare	When you compare things, you consider them and discover the differences or similarities between them.
Vistula	The Vistula river flows through Krakow and is the longest river in Poland.
academic	Academic is used to describe things that relate to schools, colleges, and universities.
artistic	Artistic means relating to art or artists.
university	A university is a place where students study for degrees and where academic research is done.
cultural	Cultural means relating to a particular society and its ideas, customs, and art.
medieval	Something that is medieval relates to the period of European history between the end of the Roman Empire in 476 CE and about 1500 CE.
architecture	The architecture of a building is the style in which it is designed and constructed.
